

Interview with Sylviane , candidate for the CA

Why do you want this job?

Well! Because I had a blast working at CA. Since I joined the CA, I discovered lots of beautiful things. It gave me opportunity to contact many people worldwide. I also enjoyed managing the website. It's hard but it's nice, it's very exciting. Moreover, I've always been involved in the defense of children's rights. I've participated in Freinet education since I was very young. Now that I have time, I can put this experience in the service of this cause.



What do you think you can add to the CA of the FIMEM?



22/07 Opening your eyes to the realities of your surroundings

I participate in the long workshop "Outings and environmental study" of Yaovi Todegnon and Yao Amenti. During an outing on the premises of ENI, we met a young man who worked in a corn field, he is a student here.

This intrigued us, so we planned a targeted outing for interviewing him. On this occasion, we learned that the ENI students receive a scholarship of 33000 F (50 euros), from which the rent for dorms and meal costs are levied, which does not leave much money for other expenses.

To allow RIDEF to stay here, they gave all the students two weeks off and most had to go home. This student lives far away, the trip to his home is expensive, so he asked the General Overseer to find him a job. This is how he found himself weeding the corn field while we reflect on a pedagogy that bears an ideal of social justice.

Before coming here, I was a little concerned for my personal comfort: the cost of travel, vaccines, medicines, drinking water, mosquitoes ... And suddenly, I realize that teachers in training in this school have to make place for us, and that this results in an unexpected expense for them which they havent chosen for. This outing will also allow me to open my eyes to another reality.
